Abstract Submission Guidelines & Requirements

Arkansas Bioinformatics Consortium (AR-BIC) 2025 Annual Conference Transformative Technologies: Paving the Way for a Brighter Future Feb 27-28, 2025

The abstract should contain a summary of the essential scientific information (must be scientific in nature) and neither promotional nor commercial in tone.

- 1. Proof of conference registration must be provided at the time of abstract submission for an abstract to be considered.
- 2. Abstracts must be in English only and in **Word format** (no PDF). Abbreviations may be used in the abstract body and must be defined at their first appearance.
- 3. Abstracts must be typed in **Calibri font, 11 pt., single space**. The abstract body, excluding title, authors and affiliations, must **not exceed 300 words**.
 - A. Titles: type in bold and capitalize the first letters for each applicable word.
 - B. Authors: include all authors and underline presenting author(s). Number authors' affiliations in superscript after their names (e.g., <u>Peter T. Smith</u>¹, Paul A. Jones²) unless there is only one affiliation for all authors.
 - C. Affiliations: include Department name, Institution name, City, State and Country.
- 4. Authors must accept sole responsibility for the statements and accuracy in the abstract.
- 5. Abstracts must be submitted to Dr. Skylar Connor (<u>skylar.connor@fda.hhs.gov</u>) no later than **Friday**, **January 10**, **2025**.
- 6. Email body must include:
 - Proof of conference registration

• I will be participating in the Student/ Postdoctoral poster competition. (Pick the category that applies to you.)

OR

• I will not be participating in the poster competition.
